The St. Cloud Metro Bus Rider Advisory Committee (RAC) held a meeting off-site on Tuesday, January 19, 2021 at 10:00 am to speak about schedule changes, the farebox update, the Jolly Trolley event update, and several clarifying questions.

The following individuals attended: Ryan Daniel, Michael Kedrowski, Nate Ramacher, Ben Paulson, Keshia Anderson-King, David Williamsen, Paul Thomas, Vicki Johnson, Kellen Rasmussen, Jan Scott, and Kelly Carlson. Absent: Jenny Svihel, Bruce Benner.

<u>Welcome.</u> Mike thanked everyone for coming and reviewed the purpose of the RAC. He will officially take over the running of the RAC meetings from Ryan, who will now act in a supporting role.

Public Open Forum.

1) Open Discussion. There were no members of the public present.

Old Business.

1) No old business was declared.

New Business.

- 1) Ridership Update (Mike)
 - a. Relatively stable compared to last month.
 - b. Still lower because of the pandemic.
 - c. Ridership will be adjusted according to public's need and possible overcrowding of buses during this time.
- 2) Jolly Trolley Food Update (Nate)
 - a. Collected \$2,580.00 in donations and 6,440 lbs. of food.
 - i. Less money, far more food this year than in the past.
 - b. Will be split between Catholic Charities, Promise Neighborhood of Central MN, and Salvation Army.
- 3) Schedule Changes Update (Mike)
 - a. Route 6, 10, 12, 21 and 31 are all unaffected.
 - b. 7 is suspended until further notice.
 - c. Dial-A-Ride is unaffected as well.
 - d. All other routes run on an hourly basis.
- 4) Farebox Update (Mike, Ryan)
 - a. We are currently working on installing operator COVID shields on all buses—after this is complete, we will collect fares.
 - b. Anticipated to be 30-60 days from now.
 - c. Metro Bus will give the public at least a 30-day notice.
 - The reason for delay in renewing fare collection is because there are many contracts by vendors requested such a change for their transportation in light of the pandemic.

Open discussion:

- 1) When will fares increase (answered by Ryan)?
 - a. No talks right now of fare increases.
- 2) How long will the bus hours schedule change be in effect (answered by Ryan)?

- a. In order to maintain essential services, this schedule change was necessary.
- b. The public's best interest is in mind.
 - i. Public is advised to follow CDC guidelines as much as possible during this time (masks, social distancing, etc.).
- 3) What should a passenger do if presented with an unsafe environment on a bus (answered by Ryan)?
 - a. Speak to bus operator about the situation
 - i. The operator will then involve a Street Supervisor for safety issues.
 - 1. Police will be involved if necessary.

Questions to be addressed by Mike in February 2021:

- 1) What should be done if a passenger has purchased a firearm and has it in a box? May they take it on the bus?
- 2) Some bus shelters do not have the updated hourly time schedule, causing confusion. What is Metro Bus going to do about this?
